


Digital skills of the EU population

Digital Skills of the Labour force



37% of the labour force do not have basic digital skills

ICT specialist jobs now 3.7% of total employment



At least 350,000 vacancies for ICT specialists



40% of companies trying to recruit ICT specialists face difficulties in finding them
