Our speakers and panellists for Panel session 1:

Gianluca Coppola, President of European Digital Learning Network ETS:

Gianluca is the founder and the president of the European Digital Learning Network ETS. He is an entrepreneur, partner and general manager at Falco&Associati Education (previously Eurocrea Merchant), expert in education and training policies, funds and actions at European level. As Chartered Accountant and chartered auditor, he has gained a wide experience in innovation and entrepreneurship as well as in the Knowledge triangle integration experience, in particular promoting research-academia-business cooperation.

Alain Thillay, Policy Officer, DG-EAC-C4 Digital Education Unit - European Commission: He is a Policy officer at the Education and Culture Directorate of the European Commission - Digital Education Unit in charge of the Digital Education Action Plan 2021-2027 in particular. Alain serves as a national expert seconded by the Ministry of Education - France for an initial two-year secondment after having held the position of head of the "digital innovation and applied research" office between 2019 and 2021 and that of head of the department of development and dissemination of digital resources since 2011 at the Digital Department for Education (Ministry of Education - France).

Anestis Papadopoulos, Director at Platon Schools in Katerini, Greece: Anestis works as Director of a modern school in northern Greece and as Chief Strategic Officer at Pi-tech which is an Information and Communication Technologies (ICT) service provider and software developer company.
